The Training Division of the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department is presenting a twenty-four (24) hour, POST/STC certified course, Drug Influence and Recognition, H&S 11550. The course is designed to teach the law enforcement officer how to recognize, arrest and testify against users of heroin, cocaine and PCP. The officer will learn to identify the symptoms of drug abuse. Officers assigned to corrections, patrol service and/or investigations should attend this course. Topics include:

**Alcohol Influence/Drug Influence  
Opiates, Symptoms and Identification  
Cocaine, Symptoms and Identification  
PCP Symptoms and Identification  
Drug Case Preparation/Search & Seizure  
Gangs & Drugs/Handling Addicts**
